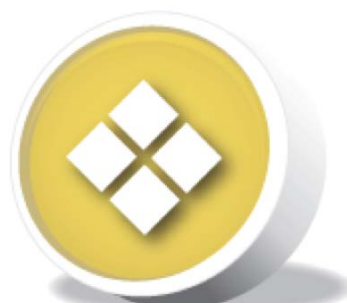

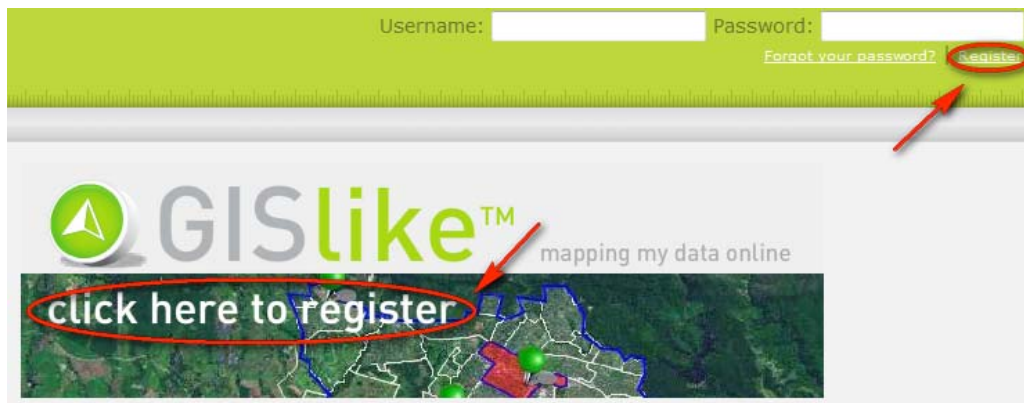

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1. Registration and Login

Please enter your personal details in the spaces provided and then click the “register” button. You will then receive an e-mail containing your personal username and password.



After login click the “Change Password” link on the top left of the page next to the AfriGIS logo

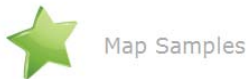


A popup will appear in which you may enter and confirm your new personal password. Click “OK” to save.


3. Opening a Map



In order to create a new map, please click the “Create New Map” button under My Maps as shown below.


